| ANGUILLA | Travellers Registration Form | Unvaccinated visitors under 18 years old are only permitted to enter Anguilla if they are accompanied by fully vaccinated travelers. It should be noted that the exemption for pregnant women is removed given that several COVID-19 vaccines are now approved for use in pregnancy. | Unvaccinated returning nationals and residents must present a negative PCR result test taken no more than three days before arrival or Rapid Antigen Test taken no more than 24 hours prior to arrival, submit to a RT-PCR test at their own expense, and quarantine for ten days in their own homes if partially vaccinated or 14 days if unvaccinated | Unvaccinated visitors who have been granted a medical exemption will be required to apply on the entry portal, test on arrival, quarantine for five days, and receive a negative test result to exit quarantine. | THE BAHAMAS | Bahamas Travel Health Visa | | Effective 19 June 2022, all unvaccinated travellers ages 2 and older will be required to obtain a negative COVID-19 test – either a negative RT-PCR test or a Rapid Antigen test – taken no more than three days (72 hours) prior to travel and present the negative test results at check-in before travel to The Bahamas. | | Mandatory | VISITORS INSURANCE | Click Here |
| BARBADOS | Online Immigration/Customs form | | Unvaccinated travelers must travel with a valid negative Standard PCR, Rapid Antigen test or Rapid Covid-19 PCR test taken 3 days prior to arrival. | On arrival, all unvaccinated travelers will be tested at the airport and allowed to go once negative | Not mandatory | N/A | Click Here |
| BELIZE | | | If unable to show proof or if unvaccinated, travellers must present proof of a negative PCR result taken within 72 hours of arrival or a negative Antigen Rapid test taken within 48 hours of arrival. | BERMUDA | Bermuda travel authorisation process online | All Bermuda visitors arriving by air aged 12 and older must be fully vaccinated. | Unvaccinated children 2 to 11 years old must take a COVID-19 NAAT test no more than 4 days before arrival (supervised antigen tests are not accepted for unvaccinated travelers). Unvaccinated children aged 11 and under are welcome to Bermuda with a vaccinated parent or guardian. Those children will take on the vaccination status of the parent or guardian travelling with them | No further testing will be required upon arrival in Bermuda. | DOMINICAN REPUBLIC | https://eticketmigracion.gob.do/ | All passengers and crew members do not need to present a COVID-19 Vaccination Card, PCR, or antigen test to enter the Dominican Republic or to enter tourist centers, any establishments or to receive services such as excursions | | Random COVID-19 testing for passengers and crew upon arrival will no longer be performed. However, when required, random testing operations may be performed. | GUADELOUPE | Certificate on honor | Passengers who do not have a complete vaccination schedule: Presentation of a test of less than 24 hours with compelling reason, declaration of compelling reason (with commitment to respect a 7-day isolation and test at the end). | | | Information not available | | Click Here |

| MONTERRAT | Access Declaration Form | | Individuals who are unvaccinated or not fully vaccinated upon arrival are required to go directly to his/her home or place of occupancy, designated quarantine facility, or place of isolation and self-quarantine for 10 days. Between eight and ten days after entering Montserrat the individual will be tested for COVID-19 to determine if he/she is negative and can therefore be released from quarantine on day 10 | | Information not available | | Click Here |
| PUERTO RICO | Travel Sale Online Portal | As of June 12th, international travelers are no longer required to present a negative COVID-19 test prior to traveling, regardless of vaccination status or citizenship, in accordance with CDC guidelines. However, international travelers that are neither U.S. citizens nor permanent residents must still present proof of vaccination. | Domestic travelers are not required to present proof of vaccination or a negative COVID-19 test before arrival. BARTHÉLMY | Certificate on honor | For travelers arriving from all other countries not categorized as green, you must be fully vaccinated | Non-fully vaccinated travelers Must present a negative Covid-19 PCR test administered within 72 hours (3 days) OR a Covid-19 Antigen test administered within 48 hours (2 days) of your originating flight | | Information not available | | Click Here |

KITTS & NEVIS | www.knatravelform.kn | Currently, only fully vaccinated travelers and non vaccinated children under 18 traveling with fully vaccinated parents or guardians will be allowed entry into St. Kitts & Nevis | | Nonvaccinated children between the age of 12-17 who are traveling with fully vaccinated parents or guardians must undergo an RT-PCR Test (USD \$150 for non-Nationals and Non-Residents; USD \$100 for Nationals and Residents) within 24 hours of arrival. Parents are to remain in "Vacation in Place" (quarantine) with the child until receipt of negative RT-PCR test results. | Information not available | | Click Here |
| ST. LUCIA | Travel Authorization | | Unvaccinated travellers aged 5 years and older must have a valid negative Standard COVID-19 PCR test done within 5 days prior to arrival | | Information not available | | Click Here |

MAARTEN | Electronic Health Authorization System (EHAS) | | Non-vaccinated passengers older than 5 years old must submit a negative PCR test of less than 48 hours or negative antigen test of less than 24 hours before departure. Oro-pharygeal swab accepted for children aged from 5 to 10 years old | If test on arrival is required, quarantine is necessary until results come in | Mandatory | | Click Here |
| ST. MARTIN | Certificate on honor | | Non-vaccinated passengers older than 5 years old must submit a negative PCR test of less than 48 hours before departure (antigen tests are not accepted anymore) | | Mandatory | | Click Here |

VINCENT & THE GRENADINES | Pre-arrival Travel Form | | Unvaccinated travelers must arrive with a negative PCR test result done no more than 72 hours or three days before arrival or a negative Rapid Antigen test done no more than 24 hours or one day before arrival. Travelers MUST mandatory quarantine for five days in a Tourism Authority/MOHWE approved Transition. Travelers MUST be retested between day three and day four of quarantine. | May be retested for COVID-19 on arrival in SVG. | Information not available | | Click Here |
| SURINAME | N/A | | Not fully vaccinated or not vaccinated passengers need to present a negative PCR test result no older than 48 hours OR a negative Antigen test result no older than 24 hours, issued by an accredited medical test entity, prior to departure to Suriname. | | Mandatory | | Click Here |

*Fully vaccinated: 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine. **Anguilla and Dominican Republic requires 3 weeks. *** Guadeloupe & Martinique requires 7 days after 2-dose series (Pfizer, Moderna, AstraZeneca), 4 weeks (Johnson & Johnson), 2 weeks after the injection (only one injection required) of a vaccine in people who have already had a history of Covid-19. ****Mixed vaccines accepted (Pfizer, Moderna, AstraZeneca, Janssen & Johnson, Sinopharm, Sinovac, Sputnik V) ***** required to have received at least one dose of a World Health Organization (WHO) or Ministry of Health Wellness and the Environment (MOHWE) approved 2-dose COVID 19 vaccine or a single dose vaccine

Please note some jurisdictions restrict movement for a period of time upon arrival, either within a designated area, hotel grounds or a corridor within the destination. Most jurisdictions currently allow movement within the countries/territories with adherence to masking and physical distancing upon arrival and proof of negative tests as a requirement for entry. Individuals testing positive upon arrival should be prepared to be isolated until they test negative. The quarantine period for fully vaccinated* individuals who test negative will be waived or reduced. Destination links should be checked regularly for more details and updates.
